RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR CARRYING OF NARCOTIC DRUGS AND PSYCHOTROPIC SUBSTANCES THROUGH INTERNATIONAL BORDER FOR PERSONAL USE

In order to bring such medicines in the country, through border, the carrier of medicines should have report or prescription issued by a certified physician.

The Directorate General of Pharmaceutical Affairs and Drug Control (DGPA & DC) in the Ministry of Health will determine the procedures of delivery/dispensing of such medicines in the following manner:

- Medicine will be issued for a period of one month on monthly basis.
- The DGPA & DC has the right to involve patient's family to review and supervise his/her medicine.
- The DGPA & DC can refer the patient to specialist to confirm the diagnosis and treatment.
- The DGPA & DC has the right to seize and dispose of the medicines if the appropriate/accurate report is not submitted.

## Terms and conditions of the medical report/certified medical Prescription:

• Date of prescription/report should not exceed more than six months from the date of issue.

- Personal details of Patient (name, age, ...etc.).
- Medical diagnosis.
- Detail of medicine (Names, dose and duration).
- Signature and stamp of the doctor
- Stamp of the health institution.
